Melanesian Spearhead Group Secretariat participation at the UN 3rd International SIDS Conference, Apia, Samoa

The Melanesian Spearhead Group (MSG) Secretariat supporting the Vanuatu government delegation recently participated at the UN 3rd International Conference on SIDS in Samoa that was held from 1-4 September 2014. The project seeks to establish agreed-upon measures of wellbeing that reflect Melanesian values in order to more accurately capture that which matters to the livelihoods of the people of this region and to improve the quality of information used in decision making at the national and regional levels.

Mr Forau added, the Secretariat was privileged to be part of this important Conference and expressed his most profound gratitude for the kind support of the Vanuatu Government for including the Secretariat staff on the official Vanuatu delegation to the UN SIDS Conference in Samoa.

Representing the MSG Secretariat were Environment & Climate Change Adviser, Mr Stanley Wapot, and Project Coordinator of the Alternative Indicators of Well-Being Project, Mr Jamie Tanguay.

The MSG Secretariat also congratulated the Government and people of Samoa on behalf of the members of the MSG for the exceptional organization and conduct of the 3rd UN SIDS Conference.

The Secretariat looks forward to the follow up conference for the Pacific SIDS to build on the discussions of the bigger SIDS and Outcomes in the Accelerated Modalities of Action [SAMOA] Pathway.
