I also acknowledge the representative of the Embassy of the Republic of Indonesia in Port Moresby, welcome Sir. We look forward to your participation now and in future MCAMs.

Finally colleagues, I seek your support in making sure the Meeting is conducted in an efficient and flexible manner to enable us to conclude on time.
