The host FLNKS in collaboration with the Government of New Caledonia will provide us an update on the preparatory arrangements for this important event and I understand you may also discuss any offers of assistance you as individual members, can provide to the FLNKS.

Mr Chairman, I know you have a very busy few days ahead of you and I would like to wish you all the very best for the meeting but more so, in taking this Committee forward over the next two years.

With these few remarks Distinguished Delegates, I thank you for taking the time to travel to Vanuatu to attend this 2nd SCM and wish you well in your deliberations.

May I also retiterate our most profound gratitude to Hon. Bob Loughman, the Acting Minister of Youth and Sports and Minister of Health of the Republic of Vanuatu for Officially opening this meeting.
